They continue to receive tutoring to keep up in their respective schools. We support six young people in their college educations. Most are local and inexpensive while two are a bit further away.

The children happily celebrating the end of the school year and the beginning of summer with activities, music, and dancing.




Congratulations to Brianna who received 9.7 out of 10 on her report card. She advances to 3rd grade with honors.
