TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES

Being prepared for any emergency is essential to caring for 40 children. So the staff took the opportunity to brush up on their skills,

Our staff received training on fire prevention and management, as well as search and rescue. It was taught by the Municipal Fire Department. This exercise helps to develop the appropriate ways of reacting in the event of an emergency in the home or in areas near the building where the girls and boys play.

Staff also received training to provide first aid in case of an emergency. Head injuries, wound care, seizures, and CPR were all taught by the local Red Cross. This helps to improve care in the event of an accident in the home or on the many excursions outside.

While living at LGF she has been a great companion to the other children and youth. She helps the little ones with whatever they need. In 2019 she became ill and was hospitalized for 3 months. Fortunately, she was able to come home (LGF), she recovered completely and was able to go back to school.

She graduated from high school on January 7, 2022. She will start her studies in Education at a university in Cuauhtémoc in February. During vacation times she was working in the operational area of a company. She was just recently promoted to an office position there.

La Gran Familia has been a great place for her to live!

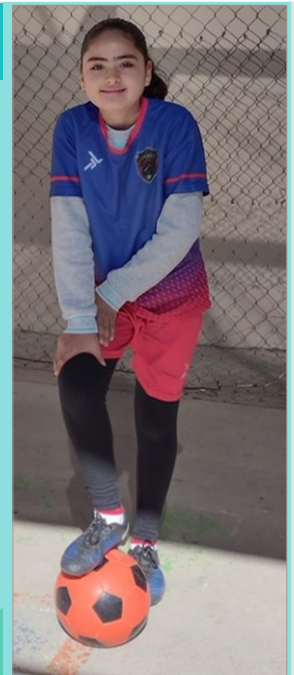
ANDREA'S STORY

Please pray that they are protected and stay healthy.

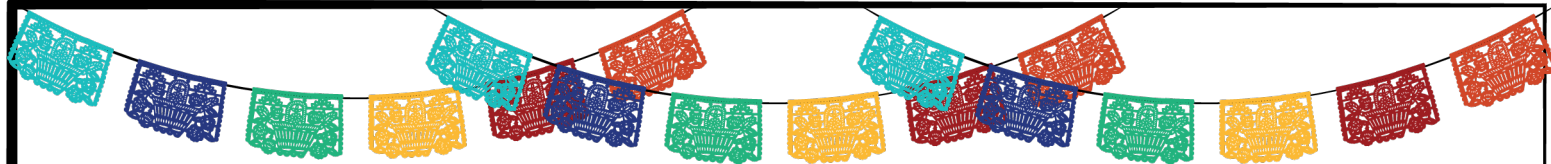
