This home is more than a safe place to sleep. Meet Alvaro and Juana Murillo

Alvaro and **Juana** are believed to be around 6 and 14 years old. Neither child has a birth certificate, and due to severe neglect, the younger boy appears much younger than his age. Earlier this year, the two fled their home on foot and walked for more than a day through the mountains. A miner found them, realized they were in danger, and brought them to the child protective services office in Cuauhtémoc.

From there, they were placed at La Gran Familia for emergency care while authorities investigate their home situation. It is expected that they will eventually be placed with LGF permanently.

In the few months they've been with us, Alvaro and Juana have adjusted beautifully. They are finally receiving the safety, stability, and affection they've long needed. With warm meals, consistent care, and a loving community around them, both children are beginning to thrive.

A Story of Courage and New Beginnings



In a quiet mountain village, a young girl faced unimaginable challenges far too early in life. After the loss of her mother, **Nati** was left in the care of her father. But when he made the painful decision to abandon her, Nati suddenly found herself completely alone.

While isolated and vulnerable, she became the victim of a terrible act of violence that changed the course of her life. For a time, fear and trauma took over her world.

Thanks to the swift action of local authorities and their partnership with LGF, Nati was rescued and brought to a place where healing could begin. At LGF, she found not only safety, but also care, compassion, and community. Surrounded by professionals, mentors, and other girls with whom she could relate, Nati began to rebuild her life.

With access to education, emotional support, and a loving environment, Nati slowly rediscovered her strength and her dreams. Today, she continues her studies and is supported by a dedicated team committed to her well-being and future.

Nati's journey reminds us of the resilience of the human spirit—and how the right support can change everything.
